MOBILE PHONES, THE CONFESSIONAL AND CONFIDENTIALITY: The Bishops' Conference General Secretariat has been made aware of a YouTube video showing two people pretending to go to confession and recording the responses of the priests involved. In view of this the Bishops have asked all priest to remind their people of the sacred nature of the confessional, and that neither priests nor penitents should have active mobile phones with them - they should not just be put on silent mode but should be turned OFF before entering the confessional.

Penitents are accordingly instructed not to take their mobile phones with them into the confessional or have them with them even if they are on 'silent' mode, as they can be hacked, and conversations listened into via artificial intelligence algorithms. These are capable of identifying 'items of interest' which may be passed on to potential advertisers. While this technology does not affect every network, we need to be aware of the potential risk. Effectively, we can be 'bugged' whenever our mobile telephones are switched on, whatever 'mode' they are in.

COLCHESTER FOOD BANK - THANK YOU FOR HELPING THOSE IN NEED: We collected 70.35kg of food, toiletries and nappies, plus cash donations of £65.00, for the Food Bank last Sunday 13th August. Thank you to all parishioners for your generosity towards people who, through no fault of their own, and often as a result of a crisis such as the loss of a job, illness, relationship breakdown or bereavement, find themselves temporarily unable to afford necessities. A recent joint report by The Joseph Rowntree Foundation and The Trussell Trust (the Christian charity which runs 1,300 foodbanks in the UK, including the Colchester Food Bank) calls for reform of Universal Credit to ensure that we can all afford the essentials in hard times. Research shows that 90% of low-income households on Universal Credit are currently going without essentials; support has eroded over decades and the basic rate of Universal Credit is now at its lowest ever level as a proportion of average earnings. Almost half of households have their payments further reduced by deductions and caps (such as the infamous "2 child limit"). The next collection for the Food Bank from SIP will be on Sunday 10th September, or you can donate at any time: just call me on 07582 502188. Thank you! James
