Why not come along to try us out, just come once or come as often as you like until you do not need us anymore.

Judy, who runs our St John Payne group, was trained as a Volunteer Bereavement Support Worker at St Helena Hospice 10 years ago and continues to work there in the Counselling and Emotional Support Team, meeting people face to face, individually or in groups, but keeping going through Covid by phone contacts.
